**HORTICULTURE CLASSES**

- 1. Cut Flowering Woody Branch, not to exceed 24" in any direction.**
  - a. Hydrangea
  - b. Other
- 2. Cut Branch/Stem with Berries or Seed Pods, not to exceed 24" in any direction.**
  - a. Woody
    - i. Viburnum
    - ii. Callicarpa
    - iii. Ilex verticillata
    - iv. Other
  - b. Herbaceous Perennial
  - c. Annual/Tender Perennial
- 3. Best Bloom in your Garden, one stem, not to exceed 24" in any direction.**

To be judged as a par class\*

- a. Annual/Tender Perennial
  - b. Herbaceous Perennial
    - i. Native
    - ii. Non-native
  - c. Other
- 4. Any Potted Plant**
- Ownership requirement: minimum 3 months
- a. Flowering
    - i. Pot 6" or less
    - ii. Pot greater than 6", not to exceed 12"

- b. Foliage
  - i. Pot 6" or less
  - ii. Pot greater than 6", not to exceed 12"
- 5. Challenge Plant**
  - a. Houseplant- Begonia maculata  
Given out at the June meeting. Propagated by Alice Doering and Jeanne May. The Begonia is descended from a plant of Jeanne's great-great Aunt Kate!
  - b. Cut stem from Crazy for Containers**
    - i. Plectranthus 'Velvet Elvis'
    - ii. Salvia Mexicana 'Tula'
- 6. Propagation Class**

Include dates and method of propagation.  
To be judged as a Par Class\*

  - a. From any Weeders workshop
  - b. Any potted plant you propagated
  - c. A cut stem from a plant in your garden that you propagated. (include dates and method of propagation).
- 7. Collection of at least 5 different cut specimens.**

To be shown in exhibitor's own container. To be judged 75% horticulture, 25% for artistic effect. Not to exceed 24" in width.

  - a. Foliage only
  - b. Mixed materials
- 8. Collection of 3-5 stems of the same family but different genera.**

To be shown in exhibitor's own container.

**\*Par Class:** A class in which entries are judged against perfection rather than each other.

**9.) “Tailgating”**

An arrangement less than 24” wide to be viewed from three sides.

**10.) “Boo, I see you”**

A collaboration of two floral designers utilizing fall colors in one container. Not to exceed 18” in width.

**11.) “Giving Thanks”**

An arrangement using a gourd/pumpkin as the container. Not to exceed 18” in width.

**HORTICULTURE CLASSES**

1. **Cut Flowering Woody Branch, not to exceed 18" in height.**
  - a. Deciduous Magnolia
  - b. *Cercis canadensis*
  - c. Other native
  - d. Other Non-Native
2. **Forced Cut Flowering Branch, display area not to exceed 18" in height.**
3. **Flowering Herbaceous Perennial (Non-Bulbous)- Cut specimen**
  - a. Native
  - b. Non-Native
4. **Flowering Perennial (Bulbous)**
  - a. Bulbs
  - b. Corms
  - c. Tubers
  - d. Rhizomes
5. **Challenge plant from Fall Workshop--TBD**
6. **Propagation Class- Plant from any prior workshop**  
Include date and method of propagation. To be judged as a Par Class\*
  - a. Houseplant
  - b. Woody plant
  - c. Hardy herbaceous
7. **A collection of at least 3 different cut foliage specimens from your garden. To be shown in exhibitor's own container. To be judged 75% for horticulture and 25% for artistic effect.**

- a. Foliage
- b. Flowering
- c. Mixed

#### 9.) “Celebrating The Ladies”

A petite arrangement not to exceed 9” in any direction.

#### 10.) “Tea for Two”

A team of two designers, utilizing two teacups.  
Accessories permitted. Maximum size of display 18.” To be judged from three sides.

#### 11.) “Wedding Brunch”

An arrangement with monochromatic flowers. Not to exceed 24” width. Foliage permitted.
